In contrast to an expert, a novice , known colloquially as a newbie or ‘greenhorn’, is any person that is new to any science or field of study or activity or social cause and who is undergoing training in order to meet normal requirements of being regarded a mature and equal participant. The opposite of an expert is generally known as a layperson, while someone who occupies a middle grade of understanding is generally known as a technician and often employed to assist experts. Work on “Skilled Memory and Expertise” by Anders Ericsson and James J. Staszewski confronts the paradox of expertise and claims that people not only acquire content knowledge as they practice cognitive skills, they also develop mechanisms that enable them to use a large and familiar knowledge base efficiently.

In specific fields, the definition of expert is well established by consensus and therefore it is not always necessary for individuals to have a professional or academic qualification for them to be accepted as an expert. Many accounts of the development of expertise emphasize that it comes about through long periods of deliberate practice. There are two academic approaches to the understanding and study of expertise. Research in this area attempts to understand the relation between expert knowledge, skills and personal characteristics and exceptional performance.



These mechanisms operate in a fashion consistent with the meaningful encoding principle to provide

Hartelius and fellow researchers have remarked on the difficulties that platforms like Wikipedia present to traditional notions of expert authority. Recognized as an appeal to ethos or “the character of the speaker,” established expertise enables the speaker to comment on specialized subjects that the audience might not fully understand. Similarly, fear of experts may stem from concerns about the influence wielded by an intellectual elite. Consistent with the socially constructed interpretation of expertise, it can be perceived as a form of power since experts can affect others due to their recognized social position. This concept is rooted in the “expert blind spot hypothesis,” which was examined by researchers Mitchell Nathan and Andrew Petrosino.
