

What is McLuck? A Definition and Overview of Its Characteristics and Features

- Classic McLuck** : Traditional scratch cards with predetermined win combinations.
- Skill-Based Games** : These are slightly more advanced variations incorporating strategy elements or skills to increase the potential for higher payouts.
- Multi-Level McLuck** : Incorporating different stages of gameplay where players must complete challenges within a set timeframe, usually leading to progressive rewards upon success.
